



Meal Packaging event

If you have ever packaged meals for Rise Against Hunger, you know what a fun and rewarding event this is. Mark your calendar for April 14, 2024. There will be a light lunch for the workers in Fellowship Hall at 11:00 AM. Packaging meals will begin at 11:45 AM and 10,000 meals will be complete by 4:00 PM or sooner. This is an intergenerational event that needs 40-60 volunteers. We need people with muscles to lift 50 lbs., young legs that can walk/run to the weigh stations and people comfortable in sitting to weigh and seal the bags. There is a sign-up sheet at the Welcome Desk.

Why do we pack the meals? Wherever there are people facing hunger, whether by a natural disaster or a war, Rise Against hunger is there. In 2022, Rise Against Hunger distributed 67.6 million meals serving 38 countries and impacting 4,489,000 lives!

Many of you may remember going to Bethany Presbyterian Church to help with their Community Meal. Since COVID, their need for help with the meals has changed. What they do need are "Wellness Items". The Eva Rose Foundation is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization which promotes safe sleep for infants and young children. This foundation was founded after the tragic passing of Eva Rose Hughes due to an unsafe sleep accident at her babysitter's. Her mom and dad, Athena McGinnis and George Hughes, and their families have dedicated themselves to sharing the importance of safe sleep practices for all children. The foundation spreads awareness and also partners with Sleep in Heavenly Peace, where they build beds that are donated to children who are sleeping on floors or are in co-sleeping situations. JKPC Mission International

John Knox and several other churches have been supporting FUNDENOR AQ'AB'AL' in the Alta Verapaz mountains of Guatemala since 2010. In 2020, a non-profit named Guatemala Family Development was formed to help expand the support annually for Fundenor. As a result, support has grown for medical, clean water systems, scholarships for young women, and construction. Please visit guatemalafamilydevelopment.com for more information.

Currently, our medical team leaves April 6 and will return April 15. We have asked you to pray for the team and/or the following individuals who are prepared to see over 800 patients at 5 clinics over 3 hours travel each day:

This trip will also take 50 more water systems to install in schools, community buildings, and churches. This will mean 500 systems have been installed over the last 3 trips! Much healthier children and adults due to pure water.

Last year, support went to 7 women in a residence and 33 more in communities and required \$40,000. Our prayers are to raise \$50,000 so that 10 more girls can be added. This is a significant blessing to the families in the communities.

Over the last 5 years, \$20,000 was raised for construction, and 2 community buildings have been built for Fundenor to teach better farming and health issues and for libraries for community uses. Perhaps in 2025, there will be another construction trip.

John Knox has played a significant roll in the rural area of the Alta Verapaz region of Guatemala. Thank you for your prayers and support. It is making a difference!

We hope all of you and your families are fine. We are fine. We have completed our second graduation ceremony in the past 5 years. We have had many challenges and faced very difficult situations, but God has been close to us.

Officially, there are 280 pastors and leaders with new tools and the knowledge to do better work in their churches. We want to say thank to all of you that have been with us in this adventure and also to those that started with us, but have been called to other ministries. Also we want to let you know that we have another 100 new pastors that will be starting new classes soon.

What a surprise it was to see snow on the ground for our Easter Egg Hunt and Funfest! The snow, however, did


