NOVEMBER RECAPS

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS - November 13, 2023 MEETING

- Session began with a reading from *Exodus 18* where Moses' father-in-law gave him advice to not do all the leading by himself but to find competent God fearing people to be leaders over groups. This led to a discussion with Session and committee chairs on reviewing our committees and what we as a church community are doing.
- Treasurer, Mindi Schibley reported that regular offering is 3% below the budgeted amount for 2023. Operating expenses were for the most part within budget. We are thankful to report the church received a special gift in the amount of \$17k to help offset the driveway repairs this past summer. Overall, we have a month-to-date gain of \$33K, with an overall year-to-date gain of \$16K including the budgeted amount from the Morris Fund.
- Noted that quarterly the Finance Committee will review gifts received from the Mortgage to Ministry Commitments and make an appropriate principal prepayment to reduce the total principal. The Finance Committee approved a \$43K payment to principal in October. The mortgage loan balance as of October 31 is \$165K.
- Rev Susanne Bendoraitis presented a proposal for 2024 sabbatical for time for soul, mind, and body renewal through exploring the concept and spiritual discipline of Sabbath.
- Membership submitted a list of members we haven't seen in worship or active at the church for some time.
 Membership is asking Session to review and possibly reach out to those on the list to invite back or learn where their faith journey is taking them.
- Lori Haag provided an update on the Preschool future concerns with Nancie retiring at the end of the school year and the options in finding a replacement and options we may be facing very soon.

Recently, our John Knox women's group got together for prayer and fellowship and packaged between 60 and 75 small gift bags for the women and children Currently living at Laura's home in Cleveland. We had some great donations of women's toiletries and personal items and small gifts for young ones to bring a smile to the faces of our friends and families as they celebrate this holiday season. Thanks to everyone who dropped off donations and are praying for the women and children at Laura's Home.


On the evening of November 9th approximately 16 people gathered in Trinity Hall to welcome our friends from NOICA for our first Cooking Club.

The is a report about what Arlene and I have been doing as a family and about our work with the ministry. First of all, we want to say thank you so much for all your prayers and support. This month

we are celebrating the first five years of the first seminary for pastors and leaders in Estelí. Today we can say that as Presbyterians we have made a great contribution to the Church in Estelí.

Family

During this year we have been having all what we need, thanks to God and all of you. Fred and Maria Arlene are very active in sports and many others activities at the school. Arlene and I have to be full of extra energy. Fred will be finishing high school the next year. He has been participating in many college basketball tournaments. Probably, he will get a scholarship. Maria Arlene has been blessed by God with many gifts. She writes music, plays guitar, sings, paints pictures, and is a national swimming champion.

During this year, Arlene and I have been part of a new project. Estelí is one city that is growing up quickly and many children have a lot of problems, and there is a lot family separation. As social work, we are helping our city in many cultural activities where children can make their gifts known. We have been part of the first children's music group, and it has been a successful project. Maria Arlene is part of this group, and Fred sometimes plays the piano.

Ministry

During the last five years we have been training leaders and pastors through the seminary, for the grace of God the program has been successful, the next month the second group of Pastors and leaders will finish theirs classes. that mean that most of the churches have Pastor and leaders qualified for the work of God with Bible base. Previously, there was not program capable of working with all the churches together.

We have finished the first part of this project. There are 280 pastors with new methods and skills to do a good job. Now our focus will be children, youth pastor, and new preachers. The second part of our project with the seminary in 2024 will be called ministerial school FIETNIC. We will be teaching three courses during the year.

Here we have a group of young people and adults who are in charge of doing recreational activities for the churches, most of them are FIET students. They will be helping us with the courses.


