## WHAT'S UP AT JKPC?

#### **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS**

February 13, 2023 Meeting

- Heard report submitted by Treasurer, Mindi Schibley, that there was an increase in member payment of the
  per capita which helps offset this cost for the church. Total operating receipts were about 1.5% lower than
  the approved 2023 annual budget goal for the month of January. There was a total gain for all activity of
  about \$7,000 after adding in the monthly allocation from the Morris Bequest. It was also noted that we have
  received some generous donations in January towards the building campaign totaling about \$5,200.
- Approved motion to accept the 2022 Statistical Report.
- Approved motion from Clerk, Marty Cook, to accept the resignation of Cathy Carruthers (6/22) from Session.
- Heard presentation from Membership Committee regarding a proposed cross-functional effort to grow membership. Goal is to engage people to serve. There was a lot of discussion around this topic which will continue to be discussed at future Session meetings.
- Heard from Christian Education Committee that Confirmation classes have started and there are six confirmands. Confirmation will be on May 14<sup>th</sup>.
- Heard that we are still looking for 3 members from the Congregation to serve on the Nominating Committee.

During the pandemic, more people in our community came to our food pantry than in the past. The congregation responded with generous donations on a regular basis to help us keep up with the need. With things getting back to the new normal, the need is still there. With the SNAP program (additional food stamps provided during the pandemic) ending on March 1st, we expect the people needing food will increase dramatically. In December, the Lakeshore Adult Center made a big donation of food that stocked the pantry for weeks! ## JK PRESCHOOL

#### **PRESCHOOL UPDATE**

We are now accepting enrollment for the 2023-2024 school year. We offer classes for 3-year-olds and 4/5-year-olds. Information is available on our website at <a href="https://www.jkpreschool.org">www.jkpreschool.org</a>, at the Welcome Desk, in Fellowship Hall, and by the preschool room. We are happy to announce the preschool has received a \$15,000 grant from the Bureau of Workers' Comp. to have an air purification system installed in the preschool rooms. The system safeguards against the outbreak and spread of strains of airborne viruses, bacteria, allergens, odors, pollutants, CV-19, and more. It was recently installed in the preschools rooms and are in use.



The new air purification system adds another level of safety to the preschool. In 2018 we were able to purchase a Tattletale security system. This system allows the preschool staff to have immediate and direct contact with first responders, if needed, by use of remote key fobs. The key fobs are good throughout the building and most of the outside space surrounding the building. Thankfully it has not been needed. We are pleased to offer these additional safety measures to protect our students and staff.

In May we will be teaming up with Dean's Greenhouse again to do a spring fundraiser. It will be similar to the fall fundraiser where the preschool receives a percentage of sales made in May and June. We will have more information closer to the start of the event. Start planning your gardens and making your list!

## STEPHEN MINISTERS

#### FIINDING PATHWAYS THROUGH GRIEF

Our John Knox Stephen Ministry will be sponsoring our fourth *Finding Pathways Through Grief* - a mutual help support group. Whether it was the death of your life mate, a close friend, or some other special relationship, grief is meant to be shared. A minimum of eight people is needed with our goal being eight to twelve participants. Each person must register through our John Knox Church office 440-777-3744. Since everyone's experience with grief is somewhat unique, you won't find us telling you how you ought to grieve. Instead, what you will find here are friends who care and understand what you are going through. The group is not psychotherapy, but it will help you navigate the difficulties of this new experience. No one has to talk but everyone is encouraged to. We will discuss the issues and concerns common to bereaved people, including:

- \* What to make of the anger, discouragement, and guilt experienced in grief
- \*How to deal with the unfair expectations of other people
- \*Where to look for people you can trust to help you
- \*How to manage the holidays and other special occasions in grief
- \*Who to consider for additional support if you need it
- \*How to take care of yourself physically

## FINAL THOUGHT

#### "WALK WITH ME - I'LL SHOW YOU HOW"

One of our grandsons was about six years old, and I really wanted to spend time with him and even share some of the wisdom that I have gained in trying to live the life of a Christian. I wanted to use my skill with words and tell him things. Ryan, instead, asked me to sit down on the floor and play a simple board game. I said, "Ryan I can't sit down on the floor like you". Ryan said "Poppy, (he calls me Poppy and I like that), you can do it, I will show you how".

When we learn that someone is very ill or even near death, we have the money to order flowers to be sent, but Jesus calls us to go sit with the person. "I have the money but I am not good at sitting with someone who is suffering". Jesus says, I'll show you how just try to listen, that is all that you need to do just now".

When a family needs a home repair, and a group shows up to help I say, "I have some good leadership skills and will organize the work and supervise". Jesus says, "I need you to pick up a paint brush and work alone, I'll show you how to be a follower".

When flower beds around the church need much needed care I say, "I am not good with plants, get someone else, maybe the youth group". Jesus says, "get down on your knees, feel the moist earth in your hands, pull some weeds, plant some seeds, water them in good, I'll show you how to appreciate the beauty when the flowers bloom from your work"

I am so grateful to Ryan for offering to walk with me and show me how. As written in the Beatitudes, "We are blessed when we....... (walk with Jesus as He has shown us how).
