#### **TEATIME FOR PEACE EVENT**

On Thursday, September 15, the Be the Bridge Committee of John Knox hosted a Teatime for Peace event where people of different belief systems, ethnicities, racial backgrounds and cultures were able to engage in honest dialogue. John Knox partnered with West Cleveland Muslim Association, Teatime for Peace, and the Council on American Islamic Relations to make this event a reality. We welcomed approximately 80 people who are

seeking ways to build bridges across different religions and cultures, heal divisions, and overcome stereotypes and reduce fear of the "other." Each person present was given an opportunity to listen and to be heard during table discussions that included learning about each person's family history in America and where we've come from. There were amazing sweets and savories provided by our Muslim neighbors, an opportunity to observe evening prayers, and we learned about our commonality and shared humanity. This was the first step in getting to know our Muslim neighbor and we are looking forward to building on the experience.

#### **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS**

September 12th, 2022 MEETING

- Heard report from Treasurer, Mindi Schibley, that regular offering received in the month of August was 6% below the targeted level of 66.7% at this point in the year. This is not unusual for summer. Historically fulfillment of pledges increases in the month of December. The 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter statements will be going out soon. Finance is working on the mortgage debt reduction campaign which they will be presenting to Session sometime this fall. An e-mail was sent to the committees to prepare their 2023 ask budget.
- Approved motion from the Personnel Committee to hire Julius Mirecki for the part time custodian position pending background and reference checks (approved through email vote).
- Approved motion from Membership and Communication Committee to accept the transfer of Lynn and Kay Bonderant to Avon Lake Presbyterian Church.
- Approved motion from Finance Committee to accept the credit card policy as supplied by the Finance Committee for Session review. It is related to our acceptance process and firewall safety in accepting credit card donations.
- Heard report from the Mission Committee that they are working on partnering with Maple Elementary School in North Olmsted to provide mentor volunteers from JKPC through the organization Kid's Hope USA. Hoping to establish this link by the end of the calendar year.
