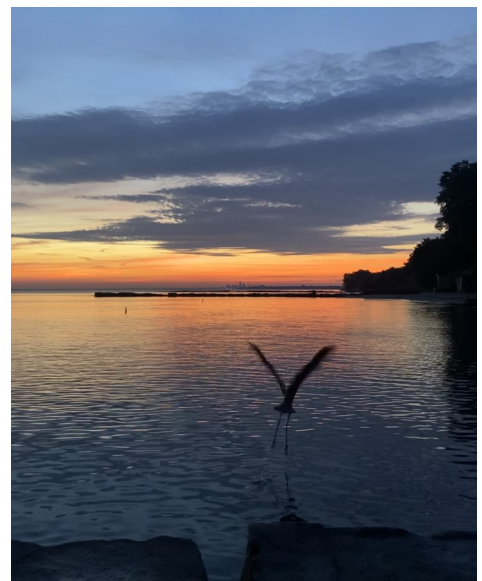

## Vote! It's Your Right.

People have died defending this right. Don't take it for granted! Voting is more than just electing a candidate, it's choosing the right policies and people who have your best interests in mind when making decisions that will affect our community, state, and nation. When you vote, you are taking an active role in deciding issues regarding health care, immigration, equal opportunity, voting rights, infrastructure, jobs, education, social security, neighborhood safety, taxes, and so much more.

Deadline for registration or updates is October 11, 2022 for the November 8, 2022 general election.

To request a mail-in ballot:

<https://www.ohiosos.gov/elections/voters/absentee-voting/>

You can request your ballot for each individual election beginning on January 1 or 90 days before the date of an election, whichever is earlier, but you must complete and submit a separate application for each election in which you want to vote. Your request must be received by your local county board of elections by noon the third day before the election (usually a Saturday). However, you should submit your request as far in advance of the election as possible to ensure there is sufficient time for the board to mail you a ballot and for you to timely return that ballot.

# CAMEROONIAN PEACEMAKER

NTA WILLIAM NCHE

September 22-28, Rev. Nta William Nche will be joining us at John Knox. Speaking engagements will be announced at a later time.

Nta William Nche is an ordained pastor from the Momo Division Northwest Region of Cameroon and serves as the National Peace Coordinator with the Presbyterian Church in Cameroon. With his deep knowledge and experience with peace work, he has been instrumental in efforts to stop the armed conflict in the Northwest and Southwest regions of Cameroon. He has participated in Cameroon's National Dialogue, served as chairman of the steering committee of the All Anglophone General Conference and presently serves as founder of Peace Action Cameroon and as interim coordinator for Together 4 Peace Cameroon. He holds a master's degree in Peace, Conflict and International Relations from the Pan African institute for Development West Africa, Buea. He is married and the father of four children.



Leaders from partner denominations and organizations around the world visit the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) each year to interpret issues of peace and justice. These visits inform Presbyterians, open hearts and minds, touch lives, establish relationships and inspire new ministries. By sharing stories of their work and witness, the peacemakers help us understand peace and justice concerns around the world and provide insights that can inspire us to greater faithfulness. Their visits broaden our sense of God's inclusive family and help equip us to build a culture of peace and nonviolence for all God's children.

Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world.

John Knox has long supported Garden Valley, and we will be receiving updates on how that ministry continues to grow and serve the community. ### Canned Chicken

### Canned Meat (SPAM and Ham)

### Peanut Butter

Kids and adults like it, and it's high in protein, making peanut butter one of the most popular items requested.

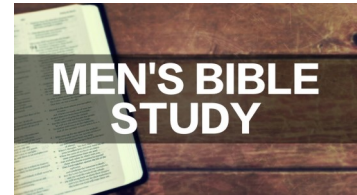

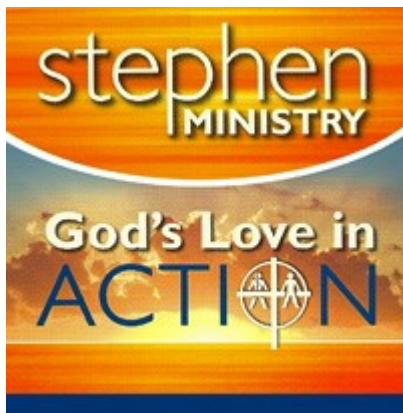

# MISSION

## GUATEMALA

Medical and water teams will leave on October 1 at 6:00 am and will return on October 10. Please take a moment and lift us in prayer that we have open hearts and share God's caring heart with those we serve.

It has been 3 years since a medical team has been in the communities of Alta Verapaz, and they do not have any systems that bring pure water unless they purchase it. Economically, this is very difficult. Our \$40 systems will significantly improve the children's lives. In addition, our medical, dental and eye teams expect to provide their skills to about 1000 individuals, and the medicines we bring the doctors and dentists will have an immediate impact on the peoples' health. Thank you for your willingness to support our efforts through your prayers and gifts.



## JKPC Support at Work in Ikiliwindi, Cameroon

In November 2016, John Knox Presbyterian Church commissioned a delegation of six (6) members on a discernment mission trip to Cameroon. The trip led to the creation of a partnership with the Presbyterian Church of Ikiliwindi. Plans were to send adult and youth mission teams every other year to Cameroon for purposes of evangelization and collaboration in areas of mutual interests. However, due to the ongoing crises in the English-speaking regions of Cameroon, mission trips were suspended, until such a time when it will be safe.

One of the areas of mutual concern that was identified was the low supply of portable water during the dry season. At the time of our visit, the water catchment and filtration systems in Ikiliwindi were severely deteriorated. To address the issue, a Water Committee was created that conducted feasibility studies and recommended the construction of a new water tank/catchment and a solar-powered generator that will cyclically pump and hold enough water to supply the whole village of Ikiliwindi year-round – a population of approximately 25,000 residents.

It is a blessing to note that John Knox Presbyterian Church is participating in this venture of providing water to God's people in this part of Africa.

Please pray for successful completion of the project, since the contractors have faced delays caused by the rainy season and a death of the family of the lead contractor.

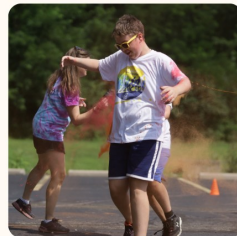
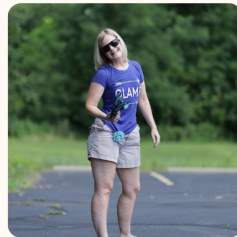

# JOHN KNOX PRESCHOOL

It's hard to believe classes will be started soon for the 55th year of John Knox Preschool! This year we are back to offering classes five days a week, and we still have a few openings available if you or anyone you know is interested.

We have been blessed to receive Pandemic Grant funds that have allowed us to stay open over the past several years. While we have received the third phase of the funds, they are restricted to a variety of uses so not all areas of our expenses can benefit. We have set up a few fundraisers for the year, and we hope you will join us as several of them have businesses donating back to us when you visit them.

Our first fundraiser is with Dean's Greenhouse in Westlake. They will donate 20% of purchases made from September 7<sup>th</sup>- the end of October. All you need to do is provide them with the flyer we created either on paper or on your phone when you make your fall decoration purchases. Don't forget to give them the flyer when you check out so they know to credit us with your purchase. We are also continuing to collect used toner and ink cartridges that we turn in to Staples and receive Staples Rewards. This allows us to purchase all the school supplies needed for each child along with supplies we use throughout the school year. You may place any used ink and toner cartridges in the labeled box located outside the preschool rooms (Room 133 & 134) down handprint hallway.

A few years ago we joined AmazonSmile in which Amazon gives us quarterly donations based on a percentage of what people purchase from them if you select the preschool as your charity of choice. Look under AmazonSmile and select JOHN KNOX PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH, NORTH OLMSTED as your charity of choice. Note that it is under the church and not the preschool and the location is North Olmsted since there are several John Knox churches listed. If you have already selected us, Thank you! 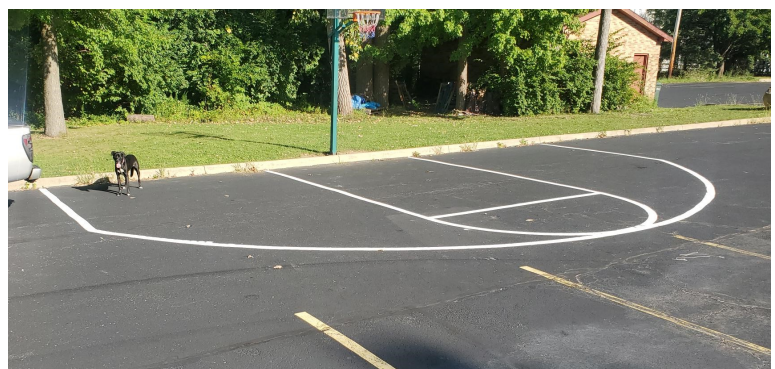
